## Treasurer's Report

As another boating year slips by and into the memories scrapbook, I hope that this year's entries are many and pleasant.

I am happy to report that attendance at club functions so far this year has been exceptional. At the time of writing, there are still more to go and I am optimistic that the current momentum will continue. If my hopes are realised, the result of the hard work necessary and the support it receives will see the club on the path to financial recovery. Figures available at the moment, although fluid, indicate that we are approximately £3.4k ahead on the year. Income from the remainder of this year's events and bar stock depletion will add to the total carried forward to the next financial year.

Calls upon the club's resources have been constrained over the last 2-3 years; a necessary measure as we recover from the outlay that brought us our new galley and showers. However, I am conscious that a number of improvements, including lighting and furniture, will soon be required. I anticipate that the club will be able to sustain some modest improvements in the coming months, without jeopardising the longer term aim of rebuilding our reserve.

A suggestion has been made and accepted that the club opens for perhaps one Saturday night per month throughout the winter. Although the probable cash benefit to the club will be small, it will help air the building and keep members in touch. I do hope that members will make the effort to keep Keith busy!
